AN IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENT FOR HOLOCAUST EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS

Coinciding with the Prime Minister’s restated commitment to Holocaust education as compulsory within the current national curriculum for history in all schools at key stage 3, and his insistence that students learn about the Holocaust from Holocaust Survivors’ testimony, this initiative represents an important development for Holocaust education in schools.

This combined offering to schools will comprise relatable and age-appropriate films that provide students with the essential historical facts of the Holocaust together with Holocaust survivor descendants presenting their family testimonies and experiences in person in schools. The accessibility and versatility of our films in providing

the historical context of the Holocaust and the immediacy and presence of the speaker presenting individual and personal accounts in the classrooms and assembly halls will offer teachers a unique and invaluable educational programme for use in schools throughout the United Kingdom.

TAILORED, VARIED, ENGAGING AND INFORMATIVE

This new programme can be tailored to accommodate the ages of the students and the time the schools have available for Holocaust education in their schedules. Holocaust Learning UK films are varied in content, style and length for screening in one sitting or over multiple lessons for easy lesson planning. Similarly, Generation 2 Generation speakers are highly experienced in tailoring their talks to suit schools’ needs. The combination of both parts of the programme represents an engaging and highly informative one-stop option for teachers and students in secondary schools all over the United Kingdom.
